



Matthew Fontaine Maury Oceanographic Library

With more than 400,000 volumes of information, the Matthew Fontaine Maury Oceanographic Library, located at the Naval Oceanographic Office at Stennis Space Center, Mississippi, contains the world's foremost military collection of physical oceanography materials. From modern media to handwritten 18th-century ships' logs, the library is noted for the technical diversity of its holdings. It is a valuable resource for Navy, government, academic and industry scientists.

Major collections, including journals, maps, charts, tide tables, books, technical reports, conference proceedings and translations, are in the field of oceanography with overlap into ocean engineering and marine technology. Other major areas represented include marine physics, international hydrography, chemistry, geology, biology, underwater acoustics, signal processing, geophysics, computer science and mapping. The library also carries titles on submarines, meteorology, marine geology, technology at sea and biological, physical and dynamic oceanography.

All materials are entered into the Scientific and Technical Information Library Automation System (STILAS). Users may view the library catalog and check the availability of materials on the World Wide Web at <http://library.navo.navy.mil>.

The Maury Library is open Monday through Friday (closed federal holidays) 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. The Maury Library serves the Navy, Department of Defense, federal agencies, universities and Stennis Space Center tenants.
